Dear Parents –

Can you believe second grade is almost over? I know it seems like yesterday that they were starting Kindergarten, and now they're in third grade. The next school year will bring big changes for your child. Not only will there be more independence and accountability for your child, but they will also be introduced to new skills, strategies, and content. And the pacing is more rigorous, so it's very important that your child continue to develop good organizational and work study habits.

To help prepare your child for 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, I'd like him/her to work on his/her 2<sup>nd</sup> grade language arts and mathematical skills over the summer to reinforce the foundation that has already been laid. This foundation is so extremely important as we build on skills and content in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade.

Please have your child continue to work in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade IXL, with focus on mastering these skills; **Do not work in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade**. We'd like your child to complete the following 2<sup>nd</sup> grade IXL sections, **achieving 100%**:

If your child is struggling with any of the sections, please have him/her review previous IXL sections for practice only.

## Reading

I would also like your child to read **two** RQ books over the summer and take an RQ quiz on **each** book. Books must be at least a on a 2.5 grade level or higher.

Before reading a book, your child can look up the book in RQ to see if there is a quiz available. If there is not one, he/she will have to choose another book.

RQ quizzes can be taken at home by logging in from the school's website, just like at school.

Finally, have your child write a book report on his/her favorite selected RQ book- see attached form.
